Amen.


Most merciful God,



And so it was with many others; some they beat, and others they killed. ⁶He had still one other, a beloved son.

¹¹this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes'?"


¹²When they realized that he had told this parable against them, they wanted to arrest him, but they feared the crowd. So they left him and went away.



When everyone has gathered at the railing, you may kneel or remain standing. Receive the wafer of bread in your hands. You may also request a gluten-free wafer. Then take a small cup from the tray: white grape juice is in the center and red wine is around the edge. Deposit your cup in the basket when you are finished and return to your seat down the center aisle. We invite children and those not receiving the bread and wine to come forward to receive a blessing at the altar railing.
