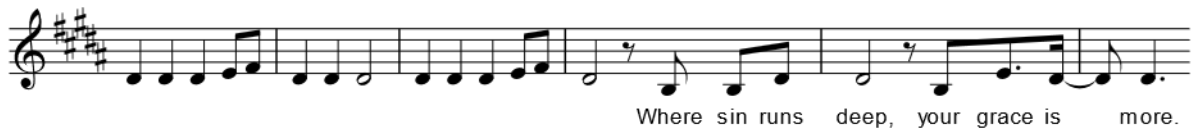

We invite children and those not receiving the bread and wine to come forward to receive a blessing at the altar railing.




