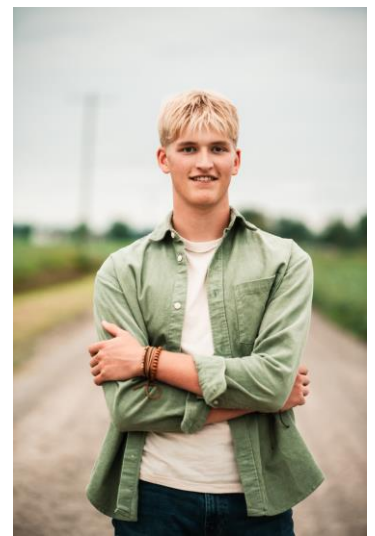


Ashley Smith – Monroe High School
