23 Truth, wisdom, learning, and good sense—these are worth paying for, but too valuable for you to sell.



Gospel Reading: Luke 1:8-17

8 Once when he was serving as priest before God and his section was on duty, 9he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to enter the sanctuary of the Lord and offer incense. 10Now at the time of the incense-offering, the whole assembly of the people was praying outside. 11Then there appeared to him an angel of the Lord, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. 12When Zechariah saw him, he was terrified; and fear overwhelmed him.




Prayer after Communion

Presiding Bishop Eaton, Bishop Kreiss and two other ELCA colleagues had a trip planned to visit Bishop Azar and companions in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (the ELCJHL). Their flights were cancelled, and the trip was not possible.

A zoom meeting was scheduled with Bishop Azar. Our bishops prayed with him and his staff and heard from them what support is most useful and needed during this terrible time for our Christian brothers and sisters and the communities in which they live and serve.
