

Gospel Reading: John 6:35, 41-51


35Jesus said to [the crowd,] "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

THE LORD'S PRAYER






SONG AFTER COMMUNION
