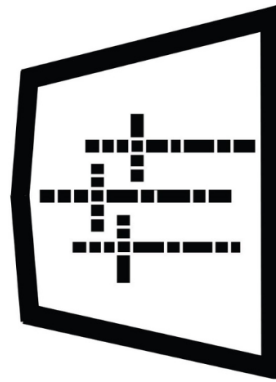

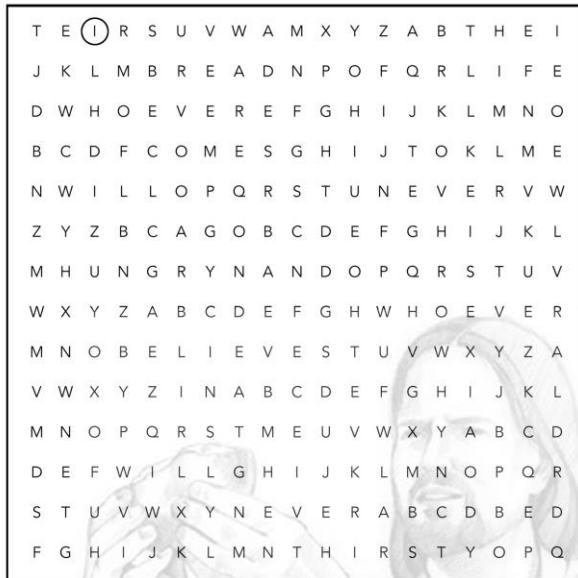

Selah's Center of Hope began in 2020, providing an unmet need in the community for homeless expectant mothers - housing and education, through the use of a generously donated low lease house, "Hope House".

In March of 2022 a 2nd rental was obtained with assistance of Monroe Missionary Baptist Church.

January of 2023 added a part-time licensed Social Worker to their staff to help new applicants facilitate the complex framework of the social services system.

God's work continued. By the end of December 2023, 19, babies have been born into the ministry of Selah's Center of Hope.

With the prayers and financial support of generous donors, their committed staff, and above all, the grace of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, the organization was able to purchase their own home in April of 2024. This home also allows an office for staff for private meetings with residents, a workspace, a yard to plant a garden and parking for staff.

paupers cemetery in the Kentucky back country. The bagpiper was not familiar with the backwoods, and got lost. "I finally arrived an hour late," he recalled, "and saw that the funeral guy was gone, and the hearse was nowhere in sight. The only people left were the diggers and crew, and they were eating lunch. I apologized for being late.

"I went to the side of the grave and looked down. The vault lid was already in place. I didn't know what else to do, so I started to play my bagpipes.

"The worker put down their lunches and began to gather around. I played out my heart and soul for this homeless man with no family and friend.

"As I played 'Amazing Grace,' the workers began to weep. They wept. I wept. We all wept together. When I finished, I packed up my bagpipes and started for my car.

"I heard one of the workers say to his companions, 'Sweet Mother of mine, I never seen nothin' like that before, and I've been putting in septic tanks for 20 years!

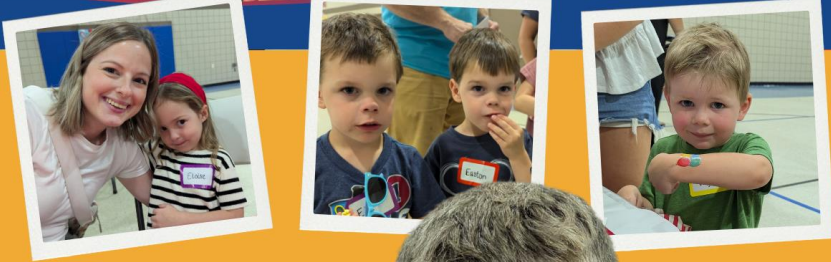

Reading - Genesis 2:4b-7, 15-17; 3:1-8

^{4b}In the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens, ⁵when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up — for the Lord GOD had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; ⁶but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground — ⁷then the Lord GOD formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being. ¹⁵The Lord GOD took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. ¹⁶And the Lord GOD commanded the man, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; ¹⁷but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die." ¹Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden?'" ²The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; ³but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die.'" ⁴But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die; ⁵for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." ⁶So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. ⁷Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

⁸They heard the sound of the Lord GOD walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord GOD among the trees of the garden.

^{4b}In the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens, ⁵when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up — for the Lord GOD had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground; ⁶but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground — ⁷then the Lord GOD formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being. ¹⁵The Lord GOD took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. ¹⁶And the Lord GOD commanded the man, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; ¹⁷but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die." ¹Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden?'" ²The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; ³but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die.'" ⁴But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not die; ⁵for God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." ⁶So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate. ⁷Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves.

⁸They heard the sound of the Lord GOD walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord GOD among the trees of the garden.
