

## **Gospel – Luke 6:1-16**

<sup>1</sup>One sabbath while Jesus was going through the grainfields, his disciples plucked some heads of grain, rubbed them in their hands, and ate them. <sup>2</sup>But some of the Pharisees said, "Why are you doing what is not

lawful on the sabbath?" <sup>3</sup>Jesus answered, "Have you not read what David did when he and his companions were hungry? <sup>4</sup>He entered the house of God and took and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and gave some to his companions?" <sup>5</sup>Then he said to them, "The Son of Man is lord of the sabbath."


<sup>6</sup>On another sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught, and there was a man there whose right hand was withered. <sup>7</sup>The scribes and the Pharisees were watching him to see whether he would cure on the Sabbath, so that they might find grounds to bring an accusation against him. <sup>8</sup> But he knew what they were thinking, and he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come and stand in the middle." He did so, and his hand was restored. <sup>11</sup> But they were filled with fury and began discussing with one another what they might do to Jesus.







## The Milt and Sally Knabusch Ministerial and Parochial School Teacher Scholarship

Minimum of \$500 to be awarded to successful applicants pursuing degrees in education and /or ministerial careers in

Lutheran churches or schools. (Preference given to ministerial careers.)

Deadline: Must be submitted online through the Community Foundation by February 21, 2025 at cfmonroe.org/scholarships ~ Targeted Scholarships ~ Milt & Sally Knabusch. Eligibility:

- Must be student who resides in Monroe County, Michigan, a member of your present Lutheran Church for the previous two years or a member of the Bethlehem Lutheran Church of Lewiston, Michigan in Montmorency County Michigan.
- Scholarships are available for students who primarily have expressed a desire to become a Lutheran minister or pursuing full-time careers working in churches and schools of any Lutheran denomination.
- Limited to those seeking careers as pastors, teachers, deaconesses, family life ministers, directors of Lutheran education or parish lay specialists.
- Must be pursuing post high school courses of study to the above careers including both undergraduate and graduate degrees.
- Must have satisfactory academic progress requirements as determined by the educational institution which he/she is attending.
- Note: Scholarship may be renewed upon application the following year if the student maintains a minimum of 3.0 GPA while enrolled with at least 12 credit hours the prior semester. Please apply at <a href="https://www.cfmonroe.org">www.cfmonroe.org</a>.

In order to update our WELCA bylaws, we will be voting on a proposed change on February 9, 2025 to the officer titles and terms. It has been proposed to change the verb iage of the President-Elect position title to Vice President. In the past, it was an expectation of the President-Elect position to take over the President position in the upcoming term. Changing the title to Vice President will allow the person serving in that position to fulfill the duties for that term and not be obligated to take over as President in the upcoming term. In addition, the President and Vice President would have alternating terms to prevent both positions being vacant every two years.
