

Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."



but deliver us from evil.



Kevin Gross is a member of Grace Lutheran Church in Monroe, and teaches at Shepherd of the Lakes Lutheran School in Brighton. In September, Kevin underwent a surgery to remove calcified clots in his femoral artery. 3 months later, Kevin was found to have a staph infection. On New Year's Eve, he had to undergo an emergency surgery to clear out clots once again. January 17th, he was taken back to the hospital to find he had developed another infection, Pseudomonas Aeruginosa. On Thursday, February 9th, Kevin was taken by

ambulance to the hospital and into emergency surgery as his femoral artery blew. While he has beaten the first staph infection and the Pseudomonas infection, Kevin is currently still battling another staph infection. Through these many emergency surgeries, hospital stays, and home health needs, it is unclear if Kevin will be able to return to work this school year. His wife Nancy is a member of, and teaches at, Trinity Lutheran in Monroe.
