¹⁵ Some proclaim Christ from envy and rivalry but others from goodwill. ¹⁶ These proclaim Christ out of love, knowing that I have been put here for the defense of the gospel; ¹⁷ the others proclaim Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely but intending to increase my suffering in my imprisonment. ¹⁸ What does it matter? Just this, that Christ is proclaimed in every way, whether out of false motives or true, and in that I rejoice.



When everyone has gathered at the railing, you may kneel or remain standing. Receive the wafer of bread in your hands. You may also request a gluten-free wafer. Then take a small cup from the tray: white grape juice is in the center and red wine is around the edge. Deposit your cup in the basket when you are finished and return to your seat down the center aisle. We invite children and those not receiving the bread and wine to come forward to receive a blessing at the altar railing.



Holiday Camp is an outdoor setting along the River Raisin that provides eight weeks of summer camp for children and youth with disabilities.

The Monroe County Intermediate School District owns and maintains the property but it is operated by a Board of Directors which is comprised of local citizens. The camp is overseen by a director and staffed by counselors who are assisted by many community volunteers.

Holiday Camp operates on a nominal fee structure and depends on donated funds and services to provide meals, special equipment, support services, camperships, supplies, improvements, and family support.

The camp has existed since 1954 and provides for those who attend a variety of activities such as arts and crafts, field trips, entertainment, and outdoor recreation such as swimming and sports.

Parents of our **graduating High School, college and trade school students** are asked to **send info** to the church office that includes name, what school or program they are graduating from, future plans, etc. Activities they participated in may be included, too. A **write-up** and a **grad photo** are needed in the office for the bulletins and newsletter. Please send that info **by May 20** to Kim Kibat in the office kim@princeofpeaceida.org
